Presenter Biographical Sketch: Pastor Brian Jenkins is a Colorado native, who grew up, attended and graduated from the Aurora Public Schools District. The middle child of five, he was the FIRST among his siblings to graduate from high school, as well also the first to attend and graduate from college. His undergraduate study was at Metropolitan State College of Denver, where he earned a bachelors degree in English with an emphasis in Elementary Education, and a minor in Spanish. After a complicated 9-year journey, Pastor Jenkins earned his masters degree in July 2019, from Regis University in Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Education. His 24-year career as a public school educator has afforded him the opportunity to impact thousands of lives; interestingly, all of that time has been at the secondary (6-12) level.

As a 3rd generation son of the Church Of God In Christ, Pastor Jenkins was saved at the age of 10. He has served in numerous capacities in the church, including but not limited to: local Usher, Sunday School Teacher, Youth Auxiliary President, Minister of Music for 25+ years, District A.I.M. Chairman for 10+ years, the first appointed Jurisdictional Dean of Education for the Colorado Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction A.I.M. Department, (serving 15 years in that position), Musician for the C.E.J. Music Department, Jurisdictional Historian, and Director of Communications. Pastor Jenkins is a bi-vocational pastor, working simultaneously in the secular world as a Spanish teacher at Northfield High School (Denver Public Schools), and as the Lead Pastor (appointed Jan. 5, 2023) of Greater Wayside Community Temple (Aurora, CO.) - the church he was born and raised in. Pastor Jenkins has a love for education and people, and relishes the opportunity to inspire, and help others reach their full potential.
