Adjutant Corp. (Members of JOC churches - only)

Have you ever wondered what the Adjutant Corp is all about? Now is your opportunity to find out. See how this vital role supports the ministry of the church from the local to the national. If you're already a member of the adjutancy, you'll receive vital information during this time of transition for our jurisdictional church.

Live Streaming: the basics – In this workshop you'll get an overview of what your church/ministry needs in order transition to live streaming. This overview will include basic equipment, online platform, and personnel requirements.

Stay Connected: With admonitions to stay-at-home it can be a bit tricky to stay connected. This is particularly true for those who may live alone with no family nearby. Even for those of us with close relatives and friends, it can still be challenging to maintain a healthy level of human interaction during these times. This workshop will provide tips and ideas on how to stay connected now and in future situations which may not be the result of a global pandemic.

Mental Health: Among the things that can cause one's mental health to teeter, is the inability to continue one's normal, daily activities. In this workshop you'll learn about a few warning signs that you or someone you know may be dealing with mental health issues. Additionally, we'll give you some resources on where to seek help for you or someone you love.

Remote Learning: Literally, in a matter of days, schools across this country shifted to remote learning in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. For some the shift was not as significant because they were either in a blended instruction situation (in-person + incorporated technology use) or they were taking classes online. For many others, however, this was a whole new world (for parent and student alike). With the likelihood of remote learning (or some adapted model thereof) continuing this fall, this workshop aims to give you practical tips for navigating remote learning. Hear from teachers, students, and parents about their experiences and what they've learned over the last few weeks.
